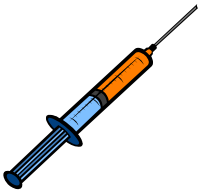

8. The use of a physical or chemical means to remove, inactivate or destroy bloodborne pathogens on a surface or item to the point where they are no longer capable of transmitting infectious particles and the surface or item is rendered safe for handling.
9. This type of incident means specific eye, mouth, mucous membrane, non-intact skin or parenteral contact with blood or other possible infectious materials, that results from the performance of any employee's duties.
11. This virus is abbreviated "HBV."

1. To destroy all microbial life, including highly resistant bacterial spores, using a physical or chemical procedure.
2. The presence or the reasonably anticipated presence of blood or other potentially infectious materials on the item or surface.
3. A type of control that isolates or removes bloodborne pathogen hazards from the workplace.
5. This term means piercing mucous membranes or the skin barrier through such events as needle sticks, human bites, cuts and abrasions
10. Objects that can be reasonably anticipated to penetrate the skin or any other part of the body because they have acute rigid corners, edges or projections capable of cutting or piercing.
